

The Virginia Landmarks Register, established by an act of the General Assembly in 1966, is to include "the building, structures, and sites which are of state-wide or national significance". It is our feeling that the Chesterville Plantation richly deserves this recognition.

The protection of these significant landmarks is of immediate concern to this Commission.
