MEMORANDUM for Engineering Service Division Files

Subject: IAL land allotment

Reference: Letter (3rd Ind.) dated October 14, 1957 from L. S. Hart, Chief, Real Estate Division, U. S. Army Engr. District, Norfolk, Virginia to Chief of Engineers, Dept. of the Army, Washington, D.C.

1. Regarding the fifth paragraph of the reference letter, it is recommended that the U. S. Engineers be requested to survey all land allotted to IAL by the Army or Air Force, as follows:

- (a) Eleven parcels in 5 plots in the east area, comprising about 26.44 acres
- (b) Thirteen parcels in 1 plot in the west area, comprising about 253.14 acres.

It is also recommended that new maps be made and new descriptions be written for this land, and that a new land and building permit be issued covering all authority previously granted for constructing, occupying, and otherwise using the various parcels of land and, at the same time, nullifying and superseding all previous allotments and permits.

2. Inasmuch as no formal allotment has ever been requested or granted for the existing and proposed taxistrips, or for the various power and telephone cables, it is recommended that the exact status, and extent of IAL authority for use, of these lands be defined. In the case of the existing taxistrip, a right-of-way of 260 feet is required. A 300-foot right-of-way is required for the proposed taxistrip.

3. It is estimated that the cost in field and office work for accomplishing the foregoing would be about \$3,000.

4. Structural Engineering Section would furnish one man (Mr. Windler) to work with and advise the survey party and give them the benefit of work we have done on our property lines. Also, he could measure angles for them with our precision theodolite in case they do not have such an instrument and should desire the use of one.
