

THOMAS GARNETT-PATENT FOR 200 ACRES

Dated 3 July 1635 - Land Office, Patents No. 1, 1623-1643, p. 201

To all to whome these presents shall come -- I Capt. John West Esq. Governor and Capt. Generall of Virginia send greeting in our Lord God Everlasting -- whereas by Letters bearing date the twoe and twentieth day of July 1634 from the Rt. Honorable the Lords of his Majesties most Honorable Privie Councill their Lordshipps did authorize the Governor and Counsell of Virginia to dispose of all such proportions of lands to all planters being freemen as they had power to doe before the year 1625 when according to divers orders and Constitutions in that case provided and appointed all dividents of lands any waies due or belonging to any Adventurers or planters of what condition soever were to bee laid out and assigned unto them according to the severall conditions in the same mentioned -- Now know yee that I the said Capt. John West Esq. doe with the consent of the Councill of State give and grant unto Thomas Garnett twoe hundred acres of land bounding upon Dictor's Christmas his land Northeast upon the head of the little Poquosun Creeke Southwest into the woods and due west upon Georg Hull his ground -- the said twoe hundred acres of land ?ing due unto him the said Thomas Garnett by and for the transportation at his owne proper costs and charges of fouer persons into this Colony whose names are in the records mentioned under his Patent -- To have and to hold this said twoe hundred acres of land with his due share of all Mines and Mineralls therein conteyned and with all rights and priviledges of hunting, hawking, fishing and fowling alsoe all woods waters and rivers and all profitts comodities and ? whatsoever within the precincts of the said two hundred acres or to the said lande or any of them in any wise belonging unto the said Thomas Garnett his heirs Exect's Adm's and assignes forever in as large and ample manner to all intents and purposes as is expressed in the said orders and Constitutions or by consequence may bee justly Collected out of the same or out of his Maj'ties Letters Pattents whereon they are grounded.
