Capt. Wilder is authorized to take possession of the farm of Jefferson Sinclair, an absentee Disloyalist, and the buildings thereon. If the present occupant Mr. William H. Lynch, will take the oath of allegiance and agree to pay quarterly in advance such rent as Captain Wilder may deem fair for 20 acres of the land and such portions of the dwellings as he needs, Mr. Wilder may allow him to do so; the same also of the Fayette Sinclair farm and its occupant, Mr. Charles L. Collier; the same Messrs. Hicks and Ewen on the Becker Jones farm; the same of the farms of Benjamin Hudgins, Eliza Jones, John and Helen Moore, Lewis Winder, John Winder, William Smith, Robert Hudgins, the George Becker farm, not disturbing the Howard family, the Lowry Farm, the Watts farm, the farm of E. Howard called the Stokes farm occupied by Mr. West and the Armstead farm occupied by Mr. Hicks. # #

" He (Capt. Wilder) will take and report an inventory of all personal property belonging to each estate and not allow any property to be removed, except on his written permit and without General Dix's orders.
